Psychodynamic approaches to the theory and treatment of sexual offenders

This forensic psychotherapy seminar will provide an introduction to psychodynamic approaches to working with individuals presenting with paraphilic disorders and other problematic sexual offending behaviours. Forensic psychotherapy emerged from a psychoanalytic theoretical framework and its remit has widened to encompass other psychodynamic approaches, including group psychotherapy, democratic therapeutic communities, and mentalization-based treatment. Forensic psychotherapy aims to understand the conscious and unconscious motivations of the offender that underlie his or her antisocial acts, which may be conceptualized as defenses against unconscious aggression and anxieties stemming from early childhood experiences of abuse, trauma, and neglect. Such experiences may interfere with normal psychosocial development, including the development of pathological defenses leading to difficulties in the realm of intimate relationships, sexuality, identity, and other areas of personality functioning.

This seminar will review the basic principles of psychodynamic psychotherapy and their application to forensic settings, and then focus on psychodynamic theories and practice in relation to sexual offenders. The links between paraphilic disorders and personality disorders will be examined, with particular attention to narcissistic and antisocial personality disorders. A psychodynamic framework for the management and treatment of sexual offenders will be introduced, which takes account of the setting in which treatment is delivered; assessment, including diagnosis and risk assessment, of the patient; engaging the patient; and different modalities of treatment. Specific therapeutic interventions and techniques will be illustrated with patient examples, and some participants will be invited to bring their own cases to discuss. The seminar will also explore the difficulties in working with such individuals, including the emotional responses (countertransference) engendered in professionals and how to manage them; as well as the challenges in working in forensic institutions where problematic staff dynamics, often reflecting the patients' psychopathology, are common.

Jessica Yakeley is a Consultant Psychiatrist specializing in Forensic Psychotherapy and the Director of the Portman Clinic, Tavistock and Portman NHS Foundation Trust in London, where she is also the Director of Medical Education. She studied medicine at Cambridge University and University College London (UCL), then trained in psychiatry at the Maudsley Hospital and Institute of Psychiatry in London. She also trained as a psychoanalyst and is a Fellow of the British Psychoanalytic Society; as well as having a PhD from UCL studying the implementation in the criminal justice system of a trial of MBT for offenders with antisocial personality disorder. Her fields of interest and research include antisocial personality disorder, narcissistic personality disorder, violence, paraphilias, risk, and psychodynamic methods of teaching about the doctor patient relationship. She has published over 100 peer-reviewed papers and chapters, and seven books including *Working with Violence: A Contemporary Psychoanalytic Approach, The Oxford Specialist Handbook of Medical Psychotherapy*, and *Learning About Emotions in Illness*.
